


School Budgets

Their message is that schools have never had so much money! Of course they are including funding for new grammars and free schools. The local BBBC news recently had an investigation on how much the Government was spending when buying up disused buildings for new Free Schools. The Government include all of this funding within the Education budget and seem to be ignoring the obvious financial struggles that nearly all schools are under. In my mind this is Fake News!

Our Governing Board will meet on Wednesday evening - at the meeting we will have to look at some painful decisions in order to balance the budget. St Mary's will have to function differently in the future because of the budget situation.

Cutting what we offer to the children, how we structure the school days or week and how we support them because of a lack of funding is inevitable.





The NSPCC's advice is that you should weave conversations about keeping safe into everyday activities and bring up the topic often but a little at a time. In doing this, children get consistent messages which help them to keep themselves safe.




Every child will be given one bag to decorate and for families with siblings they are more than welcome to decorate their bag for Grandma, Aunty etc.

Advice Regarding Car Seats for Children:

Legislation states children should be in the appropriate seat until either their **12**th **birthday** or they reach **135cms (4ft 5) in height** - although Road Safety Professionals advise 150cms (5ft) tall, as seat belts should then fit properly and comfortably.

The law has recently changed regarding the use of backless booster seats (known as booster cushions). The new regulation stops manufacturers creating new models of booster cushions for children shorter than 125cm (4ft 1) tall or weighing less than 22kg (3st 6.5lb) - they will be aimed at use by older children only. This follows evidence that high-backed boosters offer more protection for a child's head and chest areas, than backless ones.

But don't panic! If you currently have a booster cushion, you can still use them legally. However, we do advise that high-backed booster seats are a better option than booster cushions because they offer more protection against accidents, particularly in side impacts.

Old stock of booster cushions may still be available to buy, but your child will be safer in the high back booster. Please read manufacturer's labels and instructions to make sure you have the appropriate seat for your child.

The aim of the new regulations is to start a behaviour change so that only older children use backless booster seats. The changes will happen slowly as new models come on to the market and parents decide to follow the new guidelines when they buy a booster seat.

Summary of safest way to carry babies and children:

Please note the child seats go on **height and weight** rather than age. Harnesses should be tight - two flat finger rule - that's all you need to get under them. No big coats / snow suits, as the harness needs to lay as close as possible to the body. The seat should be fitted tightly to the car using the seat belt or ISOfix. Always follow manufacturer's instructions.

Group 0 & 0+ Baby Seat - **up to 13kgs** or the top of babies head crowns the top of the chair. Feet and legs are fine to dangle over, it's the head and neck that need protection. Do not change them to forward facing too soon - they are much safer rear facing.



Group 1 Child Seat - **up to 18 Kgs**. Head allowed to be over the top of the chair - once the eye line is level with the back or they exceed the weight of the chair, move them to the next stage.



Group 2 Hi Back Booster Seat - **up to 36kgs** from when they grow out of the seat above. Ideally until their 12th birthday or 150cms tall, or exceed the maximum weight of the seat.



Group 3 Booster Cushion - (no longer recommended) but legal for children over 22kgs and 125cms tall.
